

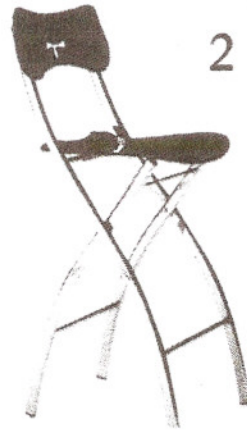
Fold school

What can't a folding chair do? It can be sat on, folded up for easy storage and even hung on a wall. But not every folding chair was created equal.

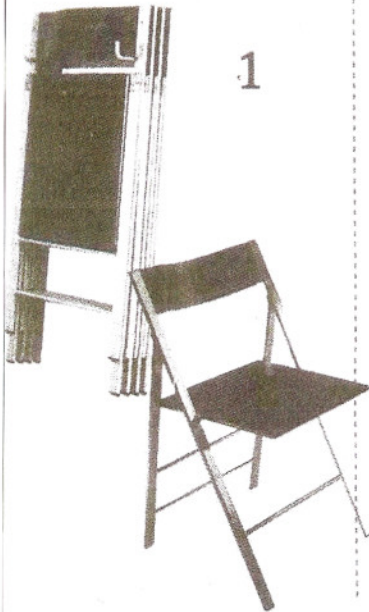
Ozzio of Italy has created what it says is the world's thinnest folding chair, called the "Pocket," only 2.5 centimeters wide. Made of metal with a wooden seat, it can be hung on a hook. Available at Milano Bedding, Rishpon.



Ozzio's bar stool "Opla Sgabello" is made of metal with a specially molded transparent plastic seat in a variety of hues. An elegant and colorful look. NIS 1,100 per chair. Milano Bedding, Rishpon.



The "Blanco" model by the Israeli firm Waxman is suitable for both home and office. Made of polyethylene. White only. NIS 575. Available at Waxman, 28 Halehi Street, Bnei Brak.
